Project Description:

The construction of a Riverwalk as a pedestrian & cycle route along the Mullaghanoe River in the townland of Lowpark. The proposed Riverwalk is approx. 500m in length and will start at the Charlestown open air swimming pool, heading southwest along the Mullaghanoe River and turning North after the Ring Fort to link up with a proposed walkway in Charlestown GAA Grounds

The proposal includes pavement construction, fencing and boundary treatments


